Your First Home Super Saver (FHSS) scheme determination

- > We have now completed your FHSS determination
- Make sure this FHSS determination includes all the voluntary contributions you have made since 1 July 2017

Dear

You recently asked us for a FHSS determination, which we made on based on information we received from you and your rung.

Your FHSS maximum release amount is \$20,361.00. This is the maximum amount you can request to be released from your super fund(s) under the scheme.

Details of your FHSS maximum release amount are:

- > \$19,890.00 of eligible concessional contributions
- > \$0.00 of eligible non-concessional contributions
- \$471.00 of associated earnings, which we worked out based on the above eligible concessional and non-concessional contributions.

Remember, you can ask for a new FHSS determination before requesting a release under the scheme; however, you:

- can only request a release under this scheme once
- cannot object to a FHSS determination once you have lodged your request for release under this scheme.

Withholding tax will apply to the assessable FHSS released amount.

What you will need to do

Make sure this FHSS determination includes all the voluntary contributions you have made since 1 July 2017 as your fund(s) may not have reported them all to us yet. If necessary, you can ask for a new FHSS determination that includes all your eligible contributions.

If you agree with the FHSS determination and you want to lodge a request for release, you can do so by logging into your myGov account.
